# June 6, 2017 PLCC Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Vice President Cynthia Rockwell. Board members present were Cathy Kantorak, Bill Morr, Ken Butler, Sue Mertz, John Hensch, Gary Metzger, Karen Metzger, and Peggy Jones. Barb Butler was absent.

The meeting was started with a prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

**Weed Survey/Treatment**: Rod was here to talk about the weeds and how the lake has been treated. He stated that on 6/1 there was a visual survey of the lake. 3.3 acres were identified to spray, per Rod Edgell (DNR). They will go ahead and treat with 2-4D and wait three weeks for irrigation. If the milfoil appears later on during the season we will let DNR know and they can retreat it.

**Treasurer's Report**: At the end of May there was a balance of \$31,065.20. There was a total of \$10,921.50 income. This came from: Dues \$3,575.00, Lake enhancement \$3,182.50, Clubhouse improvements \$2,720.00, Extra \$715.00, and Raffle tickets \$729.00.

**Minutes** from May were reviewed and approved. Motion: Cathy/ Gary. Approved. Minutes are being posted on the website.

**Membership Report**: Cynthia stated that Les is the "official" webmaster. There was a question as to whether we should restrict the minutes for just paid members. Agreement was to post them for all to read.

There are presently 141 paid memberships and 82 residences have not paid. Zone sheets were passed out to zone directors with names of those who have not paid.

# **Update on Fish Stocking** – Cathy

- DNR stocks on a regular basis
- UPDATE: Phone interview with Larry Koza by Ron Kantorak
  - 1. How often is Pretty Lake surveyed for walleye?
    - a. Every Fall, by way of shocking the fish, counting and weighing them
  - 2. When was the last walleye stocking done on Pretty Lake?
    - a. Can't remember the year last stocked, I would have to look it up, but we do stock Pretty Lake every other year.
  - 3. How many walleye are stocked?
    - a. 10 per acre, 1,840 fish in the Fall, each 6 to 7 inches long.
  - 4. Do you stock any other species in Pretty Lake?
    - a. No, it is not necessary because the other fish (bass, bluegill, pike, catfish, etc.) reproduce sufficiently to maintain proper lbs. of fish per acre.
  - 5. Comment: Larry said that they would be setting a Spring trap net within the next couple of years to catch some larger fish as a check. He indicated that they normally with the shocking method do not catch the larger walleye because they are typically in deeper water and the shocking method is used only in the shallower depths.
